



## TEMPERATURE PROCEDURE

When a staff member is made aware that a child may have a temperature, the Deputy Manager or Nursery Manager may only take the child's temperature.

If the child's temperature is over 38.4 the child's parents will be called to ask permission for the child to have Calpol. If the parents cannot be contacted, then the Nursery Manager will check the parents have given prior permission for Calpol. If the child has been in nursery for more than four hours, the Nursery Manager will give the child Calpol.

A witness must be present when the child is given Calpol and a Calpol form must be filled in and signed by the manager, witness and the child's parents and filed in the child's file.

The child must not attend nursery until the child's temperature is at the child's 'normal' temperature without the child having been given Calpol.

No child can attend nursery if they have had Calpol to decrease a temperature prior to their arrival to nursery. Staff should not
